The Scholarship Package

- A financial contribution of up to \$10,000 towards continuing professional development in dispute resolution. This is a contribution towards study or research costs, airfares and accommodation.
- The recipient will also have the option of a 12-week placement with FairWay either before or after their study or research. This may include access to mentoring or coaching if appropriate.
- The terms and conditions of the Scholarship will be confirmed with the successful candidate prior to acceptance.

Eligibility

The Scholarship will be awarded to a New Zealand citizen or permanent resident. The Scholarship is available for anyone working or studying dispute resolution, including undergraduate or postgraduate students, new professionals or experienced dispute resolution practitioners.

How To Enter

Applications close on 21 August 2019, and the winner will be announced on 24 October 2019. Each applicant will be required to submit an abstract for a 1,500 word paper. Up to five applicants will be shortlisted to provide a full 1,500 word paper and interviewed by a panel. The full terms and conditions are available online.
